

## Elevation Sketches

An elevation sketch is a drawing of each side of a building - the front, the rear and the sides- showing what it will look like when you're done with your project. Each elevation should show the location of all the elements of the building - rooflines, windows, doors, and indicate the siding or stone and roof materials, trim, etc. Be sure to also include any gable and roof vents, lights or signs that may be planned for the structure. The elevations sketches are meant to be done freehand to allow you to be creative with your thoughts and ideas. Don't worry this sketch isn't "set in stone" and your elevation will most likely develop and change over time. Although it is a sketch and you don't have to use tools or draw to scale, you do want to make its proportional.

Sketch the Front, Right Side, Rear and Left Side Elevations of your house. When you are done with your sketches be sure to TITLE, sign and date your sketches to take credit for your work.
