Mechanics	Poor Student's presentation has four or more spelling errors and/or grammatical errors. No effort is shown towards putting the presentation/ model together. (1-point)	Fair Presentation has three misspellings and/or grammatical errors. Presentation/ model is poorly put together. Minimal of effort is shown. (2 points)	Good Presentation has no more than two misspellings and/or grammatical errors. Presentation/ model is somewhat complete. Good effort is shown. (4 points)	Excellent Presentation has no misspellings or grammatical errors. Presentation/ model is complete and put together well. Strong effort is evident. (5 points)
Organization	Poor Audience cannot understand presentation because there is no sequence of information.	Fair Audience has difficulty following presentation because student jumps around.	Good Student presents information in logical sequence which audience can follow.	Excellent Student presents information in logical, interesting sequence which audience can follow.
Subject Knowledge	Poor Student does not have grasp of information; student cannot answer questions about subject.	Fair Student is uncomfortable with information and is able to answer only rudimentary questions.	Good Student is at ease with expected answers to all questions, but fails to elaborate.	Excellent Student demonstrates full knowledge (more than required) by answering all class questions with explanations and elaboration.
Graphics/ Sketches	Poor Student uses superfluous graphics or no graphics	Fair Student occasionally uses graphics that rarely support text and presentation.	Good Student's graphics relate to text and presentation.	Excellent Student's graphics explain and reinforce screen text and presentation.
Eye Contact	Poor Student reads all of report with no eye contact.	Fair Student occasionally uses eye contact, but still reads most of report.	Good Student maintains eye contact most of the time but frequently uses notes.	Excellent Student maintains eye contact with audience, seldom returning to notes.
Time Management	Poor Student did not stay on track, or use class time and did not finish by the deadline.	Fair Student needed reminders to to stay on task and use class time, but did get done by the deadline.	Good Student usually used time well throughout the project, but had to redirected slightly.	Excellent Student used routinely used time well throughout the project to ensure things get done on time.
