2. The “solution” or your invention.
3. Your name and date.
4. Any other background information or research that would help “sell” your idea to others. (design sketches, research information, etc)

*(The reason I am asking for the four items clearly outlined is I will want to take a picture of it so it can be included in your portfolio.)*

Do it well. Do it clear. Have fun.

**Clearly outlined/ organized the “problem” and “solution”.** Information is presented in logical, interesting sequence which the audience follows.
